In accordance with Article 54 of the 2017-21 Faculty Association Collective Agreement, the History Office invites applications from qualified individuals interested in teaching the following courses during Intercession 2019 and Summer session 2019.

Intercession 2019:

HIST 2720 MODERN LATIN AMERICA

Class Time: Tues/Thurs 2:30 – 5:20 p.m.

Nation-states in Spanish America, Brazil and the Caribbean, from the revolutions of independence to the present. Covers patterns of political and economic development shared throughout the continent. Country and thematic focus may vary from year to year, and may include the Haitian, Mexican, and Cuban revolutions, modern military dictatorships, resources and the environment, and gender and ethnic relations.

12 Week Inter/Summer session 2019:

HIST 2080-91 MODERN BRITAIN, 1714-PRESENT

Class Time: DISTANCE EDUCATION

A survey of Britain's experience of industrialism, imperialism and post-colonialism. Areas of study may include political and social reform, the world wars, the welfare state, and the European Union

Applications should include the following:

- Letter of application, including statement of citizenship/immigration status
- A current curriculum vitae (for the Faculty Association template click here: <http://www.wufa.ca/?q=node/398>)
- A brief statement that explains how the applicant's teaching and research background prepares her/him to teach this course.
- A statement of teaching philosophy and interests
- Three **current** letters of reference
- Evidence of qualifications (e.g. transcripts, certification of degrees, courses taken, dissertation and thesis topic, indications of successful teaching, etc.)
- Evidence of experience with on-line teaching

Candidates who have previously taught at the University in the past two (2) years (article 54:08 a) and have submitted their written statement of interest by March 1 annually shall be considered for all courses to which they are qualified to teach. Those who have taught previously at the University shall not be required to complete the application form or supply letters of recommendation for each reappointment (article 54:08 b).
