In accordance with Section 54-07 of the 2017-2021 Collective Agreement, the Faculty of Nursing invites applications from qualified individuals to teach the following:

COURSE	NURS-8340, section 91 (online) Advanced End of Life Care (Course in the Graduate Diploma in Advanced Practice Oncology/Palliative Care)
TERM	12 week session – May-August (online delivery – class will meet virtually Tuesday evenings)
OUTLINE	This course teaches the specialized assessment, diagnostics and therapeutics needed to care for patients at the end of life. This class will focus on, but is not limited to, disease management, psychological and physical support, loss grief, social, practical, end of life care management, and spiritual support for caregivers and the patient. Students will learn through lectures, readings, case studies and assignments how to more effectively care for these patients and their family members. They will learn the basics of the theories used in palliative care and the fundamentals of how to care for a dying patient and their family members.
QUALIFICATIONS	Successful applicants will have appropriate academic credentials and teaching competence, as set forth in Article 54:06(a) of the Collective Agreement, a graduate degree in Nursing, PhD preferred and be eligible for registration with the College of Nurses of Ontario. Must be available to teach for the entire term, with no conflicting personal or work commitments
