The University of Windsor's Department of Political Science in the Faculty of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences, invites applications for a Nine (9)-Month Limited Term Appointment at the level of Assistant Professor in the field of Law and Politics, commencing August 16, 2020 until May 15, 2021. This position is subject to final budgetary approval.

The Department of Political Science at the University of Windsor has 15 professors, approximately 350 undergraduate students and 20 graduate students in its MA program. The department offers honours undergraduate programs in Law and Politics, Political Science, International Relations, Political Science – French Specialization, and an MA graduate degree. The Law and Politics degree is the department's largest undergraduate program and it has the highest undergraduate entry average in the university. For this position, the Department of Political Science seeks a candidate who can teach core courses in the Department's Law and Politics BA(H) degree. The successful candidate will be qualified to teach POLS-2140 Legal Process in Canada and POLS-3140 Constitutional Law and Politics in Canada. The successful candidate must also be qualified to teach a senior undergraduate seminar in the field of Law and Politics. Responsibilities of this position include teaching six classes in Political Science, including the key courses in Law and Politics.

The successful candidate will have a PhD in Political Science, or, an equivalent relevant field. Candidates with an LLM or equivalent will also be considered. The successful candidate will also have university level, or equivalent, teaching experience. Experience in a legal setting; demonstrated organizational and administrative skills including a proven ability to work independently and meet deadlines; demonstrated expertise in academic research, or research in the legal field, not-for-profit sector or private sector; and demonstrated understanding of the principles of anti-discrimination, staff and student equity will be considered assets.

- a letter of application, including a statement of citizenship/immigration status, and how your background relates to the essential qualifications for this position. Please highlight relevant degrees, training, and professional experience, as well as any other skills you may possess;
- a detailed and current curriculum vitae;
- a teaching dossier or evidence of teaching effectiveness that includes two (2) sample course syllabi/outlines, teaching evaluations, and a statement of teaching philosophy and interests (resources and templates for completing a teaching dossier can be found at <http://www.uwindsor.ca/ctl/390/teaching-and-learning-resources>;
- two (2) samples of relevant research work, if available;
- three (3) current letters of reference forwarded directly by the referees to the Department Head, at the address or email listed below. Please ask referees to indicate the position title in the subject line of email when sending reference letters.

Only those applicants selected for interview will be contacted. The short-listed candidates may be invited to provide further information in support of their applications.
